Getting to Know Annie Armstrong



Annie Armstrong was born in Baltimore, Maryland on July 11,1850, to James & Mary Elizabeth Walker Armstrong. Unfortunately, her father died when she was very young. Annie's mother was a devout Baptist, and very active in her church at a time when there was little opportunity for women.

Annie's mother became her role model. Like her mother, she developed a strong desire to help African Americans, immigrants, the sick, and the poor. After listening to a speech about the destitute conditions and needs of indigenous

people in Oklahoma, Annie, along with other women, organized events to raise money and clothing for those in need. That

experience served as the catalyst for Annie to encourage other groups of women to mobilize in similar endeavors, organizing them to pray, give, and meet the needs of those in their local community. She challenged pastors and churches to action, rallying vital support for missionaries. Annie wrote a thousand inspiring letters by hand, asking for contributions to the first Christmas offering that resulted in sending \$ 3,313.25 to support the efforts of Lottie Moon in China.

Annie Armstrong knew the importance of making Christians aware of those in need and calling them to make a difference in the lives of others. Over a ten-year span, it was reported that Annie Armstrong had written an astonishing 77,447 letters and manuscripts for the cause of Christ.


