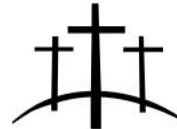

Easter: A Celebration of Hope and Eternal Life

Easter Sunday is one of the most important and impactful times in the life of Jesus Christ and in the lives of Christians everywhere. Easter is the cornerstone of our faith. It's the day when death was defeated and sin was conquered. This day marks victory over darkness and new beginnings. It also indicates the fulfillment of biblical prophecy, offering believers the hope of eternal life and reconciliation with God. It's also a reminder that death is not the end and that brokenness can be restored. The resurrection tells us that evil and despair never have the final word. We give thanks and express our gratitude for Jesus' sacrifice and the joy it brings as we find peace and healing from life's wounds and sins.

But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed. You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid Him" — Mark 16:6

This week, ponder over these things the cross of Calvary represents:

- ⇒ The cross represents Jesus, who was without sin, voluntarily taking on human punishment to show his love for us.
- ⇒ The cross is the divine answer to every cry of oppression, every sigh of sorrow, and every groan of grief.
- ⇒ The cross signifies that Jesus understands human suffering and provides us with comfort and strength to face challenging times.
- ⇒ The cross symbolizes victory over death, hope in suffering, and direct access to Him. Death no longer has the final say.
- ⇒ The cross is a reminder of redemption, forgiveness, and the triumph of light over darkness.
- ⇒ The cross encourages believers to live with greater faith, purpose, and compassion, urging a life of surrender to God's will.
- ⇒ The cross is not merely a symbol; it's a summons.

Lord Jesus, thank you for being the fulfillment of every promise spoken through the prophets. You came to bring good news to the poor, to heal the brokenhearted, and to set the captives free. As we reflect upon your resurrection, fill us with the same spirit that raised you from the dead so we may join you in bringing hope, comfort, and freedom to those who need it the most. Amen
