## Aging - An Attitude of Gratitude

In an article from the *Pew Research Center* published a couple of years ago, it was reported that 65 percent of American adults ages 65 & older consider their religion to be very important, and another 20 percent consider it somewhat important. This could be why roughly two-thirds of seniors reported praying daily. Nearly half reported attending services on a weekly basis, and more than 40 percent say they read Scripture at least once per week.

Reading scripture can certainly be a source of comfort, encouragement, and inspiration, but the *Merck Manual*, a physician's resource, notes a link between religion and health. While studies show that religion is largely seen as a plus for a person's well-being, the article goes on to say that religious people have a more hopeful outlook which is tied to improved health outcomes and a greater ability to cope with illness and disability. They also tend to have a stronger sense of purpose in life which positively impacts both their relationships and their health behaviors. Studies also showed that reading or listening to Bible verses is a simple way to connect to their faith and to encourage others.

Seniors often joke that "getting old isn't for wimps." Frustrations often occur when tasks, once accomplished with ease, become difficult or even impossible. The feeling of being a burden to family is real, as is the feeling of declining worth and value.

***Even to your old age, I am He, and even to gray hairs I will carry you — Isaiah 46:4a***

Seniors, take heart! Even though difficult things may happen, life goes on! Focus on the positive, maintain a purposeful attitude, and rely on the strength of your faith in God. Stay in touch with family & friends, and check on those who are homebound. And finally, be thankful you are living to serve God, as this temporal world is not our home, we're just travelers passing through!
