Lottie Moon Christmas Offering



Throughout her life, Lottie Moon wrote letters home urging Southern Baptists toward greater mission involvement and support. One of those letters triggered the first *Christmas Offering for International Missions*, collecting enough money to send 3 missionaries to China. Over the years, China has become the home to well over 1.4 billion people....approximately 1/5 of the world's population. Village dwellers are now flocking to megacities as China holds its own world economy.

Why should we not do something that will prove that we are really in earnest in claiming to be followers of him who, though he was rich, for our sake became poor? - Lottie Moon

Even though China has changed so much from the farmland where Lottie served for 39 years, there is one thing that definitely has not changed: their desperate need for the Savior (for more about Lottie Moon's life, see page 2).

The Lottie Moon Christmas Offering

How God Used Lottie Moon

This week, we continue to remember missionary Lottie Moon. Lottie very openly rebelled against Christianity until she was in college. It was at a revival, in December of 1858, that Lottie underwent a spiritual awakening and dedicated her life to Christ. She taught school for several years, but wanted to do more to spread the name of Jesus.

In 1873, Lottie went to China to join her sister, Edmonia, who was already there serving. It did not take long before she adapted to the Chinese way of life. She dressed like the other women, learned their language, and their many customs. Lottie identified with the people and was passionate that the Chinese people would know Christ.

As always, Lottie didn't hesitate to speak her mind. Many Chinese men & women accepted her, and some accepted Jesus. She freely gave her food and money to the famine-stricken people of Shandong. After serving in China for nearly 40 years, Lottie's health declined and she decided to return to America, hopeful to regain her health. However, Lottie never made it home. She died in the harbor of Kobe, Japan on December 24, 1912. Her life is an example that inspires us to live for what truly matters.
