Remembering Our Lord and Our Mission on St. Patrick's Day

March 17th is known as *Saint Patrick's Day*, but who was *Saint Patrick*? Maewyn Succat was born in the year 386 AD in Roman Britain to Christian parents. When he was sixteen years old, Maewyn was kidnapped by Irish raiders in the midst of an attack on his family's estate. He was sold as a slave to a Celtic priest and relocated to what is now known as Northern Ireland. Each day, Maewyn would pray many times to return home. After six years of toiling as a shepherd, he escaped his bonds, found passage on a ship, and was eventually reunited with his family.



And (Jesus) said to them, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature." — Mark 16:15

Although well behind his peers in his education, Maewyn was determined to become a Christian priest and entered into religious training. It took him 15 years to complete his studies. He wasn't ordained as a priest until age forty-six, when he adopted a new name, *Patrick*, which relates to the Latin root word meaning *father*. Against the wishes of his family, he returned to Ireland as a bishop and began evangelizing the people. Patrick was likely proclaimed a "saint" by popular acclaim as there was no formal canonization process at that time. Regardless of his moniker, God used Saint Patrick to spread Christianity throughout Ireland. By the time of his death on March 17, 461 AD, many monasteries, churches, and schools had been established in Ireland.

As St. Patrick's Day approaches, may we take to heart how God used Maewyn Succat to bring Christianity to Ireland, converting a pagan society to Christ; knowing he can use each of us to spread the gospel where we are planted as well. May we also recall the God we love when we see a three-leaf shamrock, which St. Patrick often used to describe the Holy Trinity of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit to others.
