## This Sunday at CRBC...

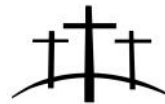

## From Slave to Missionary

St. Patrick's Day represents more than just the luck of the Irish. There is spiritual meaning behind this day that devout Irish Catholic's observe every March 17<sup>th</sup> as they remember St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. Patrick was born in Great Britain in the 4<sup>th</sup> century to wealthy parents. Though Patrick's father was a church deacon, the family was not religious. It is believed that Patrick's father took on the clergyman role for its tax incentives.

At 16, Patrick was kidnapped by Irish raiders during an attack on the family's estate. He was brought back to the thieves' home country and was put to work as a shepherd. Held captive for over six years, Christianity became a means of comfort and hope to Patrick. He heard a voice whom he believed to be God, urging him to leave Ireland, so he escaped back to Britain, eventually reuniting with his family.

There, Patrick claimed an angel came to him in a dream and encouraged him to return to Ireland, this time as a missionary. Patrick dedicated more than 15 years of his life to religious studies and became an ordained priest. Per his Christian teachings, he taught the word of the Lord to encourage more Irish people to convert to Christianity. According to legend, Patrick is remembered for illustrating the Holy Trinity: Father, Son and Holy Spirit with a shamrock. Just as a shamrock has one stem with three leaves, God is one entity with three persons. Today, the shamrock is a symbol of Ireland, representing Irish culture and luck.



It's believed that St. Patrick died on March 17, 460 A.D., hence the holiday's annual date. Due to the period in which he lived, he was not declared a saint by the church, but instead, by popular acclaim as he is remembered for spreading Christianity throughout Ireland. In America, the first St. Patrick's Day parade took place on March 16, 1601 in what is now St. Augustine, Florida. And in 2026, the Irish holiday is celebrated worldwide with parades, festivities, and celebrations.
